New Bishop for the Diocese of Parramatta

Most Rev Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFMConv DD has been appointed fourth Bishop of Parramatta. He has been Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Melbourne since 2011.

Bishop Long Van Nguyen was born in 1961 in Gia-Kiem, Vietnam and came to Australia with his family in 1980 as a refugee. After his ordination to the priesthood on 30 December 1989 he went to Rome for further studies and was awarded a licentiate in Christology and Spirituality from the Pontifical Faculty of St Bonaventure. He was elected superior of the Order of Friars Minor Conventuals in Australia in 2005 and was parish priest of Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville from 1998 to 2002. Bishop Vincent will be formally installed as Bishop of Parramatta Diocese in St Patrick's Cathedral at a date to be set in the near future.

Pentecost Sunday, Year C May 15th 2015



John 20: 19-23 Jesus gives the gift of the Holy Spirit

Fifty days after the resurrection there was a spectacular manifestation of the power of the Spirit. This event launches the mission to the whole world. Our gospel teaches that the Holy Spirit was also given by the risen Christ before the events of Pentecost. This is a guieter and more intimate demonstration of the power of the Spirit. It is related to the preaching of forgiveness and the possibility of new life for those who ask for it. The disciples are empowered to bring the forgiveness of Christ, but it is possible for people to reject this forgiveness. This is the final day of the Easter period. The Lord who died on the cross has shown himself in his risen body. He has taken our humanity into the presence of the Father. He is no longer visibly present, but his Spirit is with us to remind us of Jesus and to lead us into all truth. We can reflection on these questions: Do I allow the Holy Spirit to transform my life? Do I seek the peace and forgiveness offered to me through prayer and the sacraments?

Let us pray for the whole church, that Christians everywhere will be enlivened by the Holy Spirit and that the Easter gifts of Christ will always be with us.

May, the month to honour Mary



In May, devotion to Mary is made know through Hail Holy the crowning of statues of Mary, the recognition of her as Queen of All Saints. The church recognises the unique role that Mary had in the life of Jesus and that she now has in the church. She carries the titles Mother of God and the Mother of the Church, among others. At St Angela's, we are using 'Hail Holy Queen prayer cards in class each day after the Angelus to celebrate our devotion to Mary.


