## **Religious Education**

June 12th, 2016

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time,



#### Luke 7:36-8:3 A sinful woman anoints Jesus' feet.

In today's Gospel Jesus sits down to eat a meal at the house of Simon, a Pharisee. A sinful woman approaches him, falls to her knees, wets his feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, and then anoints them with oil. Simon the Pharisee challenges Jesus, telling him that a prophet would surely know that a sinful person was touching him. Jesus responds by telling a story about the true nature of forgiveness. After telling the story, Jesus turns to the woman and tells her that her sins are forgiven. This leaves the crowd to ask, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" Awareness of God's forgiveness through the presence of Jesus leads the woman to demonstrate her love in an intimate way. The forgiveness of God in Christ cannot be earned by good works, but is freely given to those who are aware of their sin and seek it.

Year 3 Liturgy Wednesday 1st June - Year 3's Liturgy honoured Mary, the mother of Jesus, who followed the will of God

all her life. She said yes to what God asked of her. Mary is a model of faith for all of us. She helps us to know and believe in Jesus. We honour you, Mary, as the Mother of God and our mother too.

Mary was always faithful to God's will. She was faithful at the stable in Bethlehem. she was faithful on the flight to Egypt, she was faithful when Jesus was lost in the temple.

she was faithful in Nazareth and she was faithful at the foot of the cross. We pray that we will follow her example and be faithful to God's will in our lives. Amen.
