## Feast of St Maximilian Kolbe

This Monday is the Feast Day of St Maximilian Kolbe, the Saint that our Hall is named after. At our morning assembly we will have a prayerful remembrance and celebration of the life of St Maximilian Kolbe. He was a wonderful example to us all of the selfless love that reflects the words of Jesus 'love one another as I have loved you'. 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In thinking about how respect towards each other is so important, I enjoyed the following reflection that gives 10 simple points to always remember. Why not take the time to share this with your child.

1. Speak to people. There is nothing as nice as a cheerful word of greeting.

2. Smile at people. It takes 72 muscles to frown and only 14 to smile.
3. Call people by name. The sweetest music to anyone's ear is the sound of their own name.
4. Be friendly and helpful. Be a friend to all.
5. Be cordial. Speak and act as if everything you do were a genuine pleasure.
6. Be genuinely interested in people. You can like everybody if you try.
7. Be generous with praise, cautious with criticism.
8. Be considerate of the feelings of others, it will be appreciated.
9. Be thoughtful of the opinions of others, there are always three sides to controversy - yours, the other person's and the right one.
10. Be alert to give service. What counts most in life is what we do for others.

### Gospel Mt 14:22-33

#### **Jesus walks on the water**

The cry of Peter is one that each of us feels the need to cry out at some stage in our life. Jesus trusted Peter's ability to walk to him on the water; otherwise he would not have called Peter to do so. It is Peter who doubts himself. In this moment of realising that he can't do it alone, he calls out to Jesus. One of the enduring images of Jesus is as the one who saves – the Saviour. When the realisation eventually comes to each of us that we can't do it all alone, we need only call on the one who saves.

On Tuesday, the 8<sup>th</sup> of August 2 Green lead us in a prayer to celebrate the feast day of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Saint Mary MacKillop is one of the most remarkable and inspiring women Australia has produced.

Despite a vow of poverty, Mary managed to make education available to disadvantaged people. She established the Sisters of St Joseph, the first religious order to be founded by an Australian. When faced with challenging times, Mary refused to attack those who undermined her. She continued in her calling, and was always ready to forgive those who did her wrong.

Mary MacKillop was a woman of action. She showed compassion for anyone in need, regardless of race, colour or faith, and a reverence for the dignity of others, especially those most neglected in society. We celebrate her life and remember her words "Let us all have courage" MARY MACKILLOP.

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Next Tuesday, the 15<sup>th</sup> of August is The Feast of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We commemorate the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a Holy Day of Obligation.

Grades 3 – 6 from St Angela's will travel to OLOR to celebrate mass with them at 9.30am in Our Lady of the Rosary Church. This will be a wonderful opportunity to pray together as members of a parish as well as God's family. All are welcome to attend.

## Values Matter at St Angela's

What are values? *Ideals that guide our behaviour.* They are ideals and beliefs we hold as special. Caring for others, for example, is a value; so is the freedom to express our opinions. Values are what people think is right and wrong, good and bad, desirable and undesirable.

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This week we are focussing on the value of: **Fair Go** - *Pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly - for a just society.*

**"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."** Mt 5:6

*In this beatitude Jesus invites us to be passionate about the promotion of justice, not just thinking that the concept of justice is a good idea. Justice people are action people.*

**This value includes the following characteristics:**

- Respecting authority *Do you teach by example?*
- Being involved in your community. *What do you do as a family/individuals to show you "care?"*
- \* *Does your child belong to a community group that is involved in helping others?*
- \* *As a family, do you provide for people less fortunate than yourselves? eg. St Vincent De Paul*
- Accepting other people and their backgrounds and
- ✦ Being tolerant and understanding of difference which includes religious, physical, family or personality differences

The overall message:

*Being committed to the principles of social justice, opposing prejudice, dishonesty and injustice.*
