# **Religious Education**

Sunday, 27 May 2018: The Most Holy Trinity - Year B

Gospel Mt 28:16-20

Jesus sends forth the Apostles with the promise to be with them always.

The Easter season celebrates some of the most important events and beliefs in Christian tradition. In the last seven weeks, we have remembered Jesus' Last Supper with his friends (regarded as the institution or establishment of the Eucharist); Jesus' death on the cross; the discovery of the empty tomb on Easter Sunday; the appearances of the Risen Lord to his disciples; the Ascension into heaven; and finally, the Holy Spirit filling the disciples at Pentecost. They are events that have shaped Christian belief for nearly 2,000 years. They provide the basis of beliefs and teachings such as: Christ present in the Eucharist; the resurrection of Jesus and the hope of resurrection for all people; the divinity of Jesus; and the ongoing action of the Holy Spirit in the world. The period of Easter-Pentecost celebrates these truly momentous events, beliefs and teachings.

Almost to round off this extraordinary focus on Christian beliefs and teachings, the Church this week celebrates the central doctrine of Christian faith: The Trinity. The belief in the Trinity is the belief that there are three 'persons' in the one Godhead: Father; Son; and Holy Spirit. The understanding and articulation of this doctrine occurred over time and was not until well after the writing of the gospels and other New Testament letters. Consequently, there are no specific scriptural passages that identify explicitly the doctrine of the Trinity. This week's gospel passage, the commissioning of the disciples from the Gospel of Matthew is perhaps the closest any New Testament writer comes to an expression of the Trinity when Jesus instructs the disciples to baptise 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'.

Next Thursday, the 31st of May is The feast of the Visitation when we recall the visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth shortly after the Annunciation. Grades 3 to 6 from St Angela's will travel to OLOR to celebrate mass together at 9.15am in Our Lady of the Rosary Church. This will be a wonderful opportunity to pray together as members of a parish as well as God's family. All are welcome to attend.

Congratulations to our Year 3 children who received the sacrament of First Eucharist. As a school and parish community we celebrate and share this joyous occasion with our students and continue to remember them in our prayers.

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Lord Jesus Christ, in the Sacrament of the Eucharist You left us the gift of your limitless love. Thank You for giving these children the opportunity to experience this love in receiving the Sacrament for the first time. May your Eucharistic presence keep them ever free from sin, strengthened in faith, infused by love for God and neighbour, and fruitful in goodness, and may they continue to receive You throughout their lives.

#### **Session 4 - Being Supportive**


This week in the Peer Support session, children will be focusing on the importance of support networks and the role that friends play in each other's lives. Children will construct a visual representation of this during the session.

#### **Changing Going Home Arrangements**

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:30am until 2:50pm, with a 5 minute dismissal zone, and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. Appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made. We ask that all early departures and changes to going home arrangements are advised in writing stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au before 2.30pm on the day the change is taking place. Please do not email going home changes days in advance. This assists with our process of notifying the class teacher via their office bag.

Please note children will only be called to the office when you arrive to collect them. We ask that you do not contact the office requesting your children be ready and waiting for your arrival as delays in traffic etc. may result in children waiting for long periods. We thank you for your support in this area.

#### **Medication Information**

Prescription medication is only administered to students upon completion of St Angela's medication forms, which are available from the school office or on our website under the following pathway:

School Information, School Notes, Medical Forms or by clicking the following link:

There are two types of forms:

- Doctor Forms for Prescribed Medication
  (to be completed by Doctor and Parent)

  If your child requires <u>prescription</u> medication to be permanently stored for administration at school, ie.

  Anaphylaxis/Allergies or Asthma, these forms are required to be completed by a parent and your child's doctor.
- Short Term Prescribed Medication (to be completed by Parent)

If your child requires <u>prescription</u> medication to be administered on a short term basis, ie. 1-5 days, please complete this form.

Please note we are unable to administer prescription medication unless the relevant form, as outlined above, is completed. Handwritten notes are not satisfactory for the administration of medication.

All prescription medication for your child must be delivered to and collected from the office **by a parent**. For safety reasons, prescription medication should not be carried by children. All prescription medication is required to be supplied in its original container, clearly labelled with your child's name, the name of the medication, dosage and frequency of administration. Appropriate equipment for administering medication is to be supplied by the parent, eg. Asthma spacer. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure all medication remains current. All medication sent to school is kept in the School Office.

#### NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Non-prescription medication is not administered by the school, eg. Panadol, antihistamine, creams, ointments, eye drops etc. The only exception to this is if a doctor completes the appropriate abovementioned form.
