Gospel Mk 9:30-37

The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of humanity ... All who wish to be first must make themselves the servants of

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms around him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'

Year 5 Project Based Learning 'God Gave Us A Voice'

This term, Year 5 students have been working on an individual Project Based Learning task to answer the following driving questions:

How can we use the power of voice as modern day Disciples of Christ, to convey the message of truth, justice and peace in our world? Like Jesus used parables, how can we create a social conscience for a need in our world today?

Students analysed incredible and inspirational speeches from both children and adults. They then worked hard to research a topic of their choice to create and deliver a powerful and persuasive speech. Each student had the opportunity to present to small groups as well as their class and teacher in order to receive feedback to enhance their public speaking skills.

This culminated in a liturgy on Wednesday to celebrate how 'God Gave Us A Voice'. We are extremely proud of the speeches the Year 5 students have presented this week. They have inspired us all to go out and make a difference in our world.'

Year 6 Design and Make Day

Last Friday, Year 6 students spent time on an independent design and make task directly linked to their PBL Science and Technology unit, 'Earth's Place in Space'. A major portion of the unit incorporated Project Based Learning. All students were faced with the following driving question: How can we, as educational product designers, create a tool that will educate children, aged between 5 and 7, on an aspect of space? This question has led to a range of product designs, including board games, websites, iMovies, dioramas, puzzles and books to name a few. The children are almost ready to launch their products and look forward to having their parents and K-1 students visit their displays in the Hall next Tuesday afternoon from 1:45 - 2:30pm.
