Sunday, 26 Feb 2017: Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

Mt 6:24-34 Don't worry about tomorrow

In Sunday's Gospel there is an incredible challenge to simply be mindful of the now. If we can be mindful of what we're doing *now* then we can be purposeful and intentional about our actions rather than always operating on auto pilot or operating reactively. When we live in the *now*, instead of the *once was* or *soon to be*, then we find ourselves actually listening to our friends when they speak to us; savouring the food we eat; noticing both the beauty and the pain around us; and sometimes even becoming aware of the presence of God around and within us. Sundays's gospel tells us not to worry about what is to come but be attentive to the way we are living our lives. It tells us to be attentive to living in accordance with the will of God and when we do that it will be amazing just how other things seem to fall into place.

Q. What does this gospel tell us about the sort of relationship God wants to have with us?

Q. What is one thing in your life that is a *distraction* from you being the best you can be?

PROJECT COMPASSION 2017 Caritas Australia's Project compassion calls on everyone to "Love Your Neighbour" in 2017. This year project compassion demonstrated how love for our neighbours can transform lives by empowering individuals and communities in six countries around the world. Starting on Ash Wednesday, 1st March, the children will hear stories from people in The Philippines, Timor Leste, Indigenous Australia, Vietnam, and Fiji. Their stories will humble and inspire us, and show how our contributions to Project Compassion help people build better lives for themselves, their families and their communities. Each class will have a Project Compassion Box in their classroom during LENT and the children are encouraged to think about 'helping our neighbours' through a small donation.

We will mark the beginning of the Season of Lent on **Ash Wednesday**, March 1, with a mass at 11am. All welcome to attend. We will receive ashes on our foreheads which symbolise the dust from which God made us.

Year 1 will celebrate a grade Liturgy in the hall at 2:20pm on Thursday 9th March. All are welcome to attend.

Returning Notes and Permission Slips

For those families who are new to the school or those who may be unaware of our procedures:

Each morning teachers will ask the children in their class if they have any notes or money. Teachers will keep any information they require and will send any other notes or money to the office via the class note bag (please ensure envelopes containing money are tightly secured and labelled). This system allows the office to receive notes and money efficiently. It also helps the children develop responsibility for passing on information.

Why is my Child's Teacher out of Class?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time at the beginning of the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. At times, teachers are also required at diocesan events etc. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day book is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the substitute teacher so that good teaching and learning continues and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this area.

Have You Returned Your Medication Forms and Action Plan?

Thank you to those parents who have returned St Angela's forms and action plans if your child has medication stored or administered at school due to anaphylaxis, allergies or asthma. If you have not updated your paperwork, could you please do so as a matter of importance. If you require forms to be resent, please contact the school office. If your child no longer requires medication to be stored at school, please email stangelas@parra.catholic.edu.au and we will remove your child's name from our records. It is essential that these forms and action plans are updated annually by your child's doctor so that our records are accurate and reflect the needs of each individual child. As noted, it is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child's medication remains current, ie. not expired. Please note this in a diary or on your phone. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.

Medical Bracelets

An email will be sent home shortly to all our families whose children suffer from anaphylaxis, allergies, asthma, diabetes and heart conditions regarding the ordering of medical bracelets. In the interests of your child/children's safety, please note the wearing of medical bracelets is compulsory at St Angela's.
