Dear Parents,

Opening School and Ash Wednesday Masses

Thank you to the many parents who were able to attend last week's Opening School Mass and our Ash Wednesday Mass yesterday. They were both a wonderful celebration of faith and of our Christ centred community at St Angela's. Appreciation to Mrs Yager, our Religious Education Coordinator, for her excellent work in coordinating our celebrations and to the staff for their efforts in making the morning so special. Thank you to Fr Alejandro for his blessings for a fruitful year ahead.

Ash Wednesday, celebrated yesterday, marks the beginning of Lent. During this Liturgical season of the Church, children and adults may sometimes ask the question: "What is Ash Wednesday?" The ashes used are made by burning the remains of the palms blessed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance (sackcloth and ashes). They also remind us of our mortality ("remember that you are dust"). Being marked with ashes at the beginning of Lent indicates our recognition of the need for deeper conversion of our lives during this season of renewal. During Lent, the Church asks us to contemplate ongoing conversion. To achieve conversion, the Church proposes the practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

It is the focal point of the Church's liturgical year. It occurs forty days before Good Friday. We are reminded to be faithful to the Gospels. Believing in the Gospels helps us to walk with Jesus. We can be guided along this journey by such Gospel values as Love, Hope, Trust, Service, Forgiveness, Peace, Respect, Acceptance, Compassion and Justice.

Catholic Schools Week

This year we will once again join with more than 620 Catholic schools across NSW and the ACT to celebrate Catholic Schools Week. There is so much faith, fun and learning that takes place at St Angela's that our Catholic Schools Week will be held over a two week period, from 6th March to 17th March.

Additionally, during Catholic Schools Week (Week 7 - 6th to 10th March), we will once again have our termly "**Family Week**". Family Week sees the children have a break from formal home learning (although we ask that every child still reads each night) to spend time with you as a family, or helping you for the family. You may choose an activity that you can do as a family each day with your child. Examples in the past have included playing a board game, sitting and sharing stories, cooking a meal together, feeding the pet, playing

Gospel Mt 4:1-11


Theme for the Week:

What Happens in a Literacy Block?

(As presented at our General Parent Meeting)

Students at St Angela's follow the Parramatta Literacy and Numeracy strategy called Focus 160. This means that every day, children will undertake 100 minutes of Literacy and 60 minutes of Numeracy. Our Literacy Block consists of:

- Purposeful Talk
- Daily Reading Aloud to Students (5-10 mins)
- Daily Shared Reading (10-20 mins)
- Small Group Reading Instructional Practices (15-30 mins at least once a week)
- Guided Reading
- Daily Independent Reading of familiar texts (5-15 mins)
- Daily Modelled Writing or Shared Writing (10-20 mins)
- Guided Writing (10-20 mins at least once a week)
- Daily Independent Writing (15-30 mins)

MEDICATION INFORMATION

Prescription medication is only administered to students upon completion of St Angela's medication forms, which are available on our website under the following pathway:

School Information, School Notes, Medical Forms

Please note there are two types of forms:

•	Doctor Forms for Prescribed Medication (to be completed by Doctor and Parent) If your child requires prescription medication to be
	permanently stored for administration at school, ie. Anaphylaxis/Allergies or Asthma, these forms are required to be completed by a parent and your child's doctor.
•	Short Term Prescribed Medication

(to be completed by Parent) If your child requires prescription medication to be administered on a short term basis, ie. 1-5 days, please complete this form.

Please note we are unable to administer prescription medication unless the relevant form outlined above is completed. Handwritten notes are not satisfactory as instructions for the administration of medication.

All prescription medication for your child must be supplied in its original container and be delivered to and collected from the office **by a parent**. For safety reasons, prescription medication should not be carried by children. All prescription medication is required to be clearly labelled with your child's name, the name of the medication, dosage and frequency of administration. Appropriate equipment for administering medication is to be supplied by the parent, eg. Asthma spacer. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure all medication remains current. All medication sent to school is kept in the School Office.

NON-PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Non-prescription medication is not administered by the school, eg. Panadol, antihistamine, creams, ointments, eye drops etc. The only exception to this is if a doctor completes the appropriate abovementioned form.
