Prayer at St Angela's is thriving. Throughout Lent and during Catholic School's fortnight our classrooms have been filled with our students and teachers building relationships with God through prayer.

- Every Monday we begin our school week with a reflection • on the Sunday Gospel
- Last Friday was very special as the students K-6 • participated in a reflective prayer similar to that which would be experienced on a pilgrimage.
- On a daily basis all classes stop at 12:00 midday to pray • the Angelus and in doing so join students in the 80 Catholic schools across the Parramatta Diocese who also stop at this same time to pray.
- Each grade's Religious Education Unit includes a prayer celebration prepared by the teachers and students.
- Whole school prayer liturgies on special feast days help the children focus on the rich traditions of our faith. Today, Year One shared a prayer liturgy focused on the Annunciation.

I am so proud of the respectful and reverent way in which our students approach prayer. I am also delighted that the strong foundations in prayer that the children are receiving at this young age are ensuring that they come to know that God is always accessible and always there for them. In a COVID world and with the current floods that are devastating our nearby communities of the Hawkesbury and Nepean the children have been so generous in offering prayers for the vulnerable and those in need. We can never underestimate the power of prayer and most especially the power of children's prayer. Let us join together and pray:

Compassionate God, source of all comfort, We pray for the people whose lives have been devastated by rain and flood. Bring them comfort, we pray. Protect the vulnerable. Strengthen the weak. Keep at bay the spread of disease. Have mercy on all those working to rescue the stranded and to feed the hungry. And may our response to their suffering be generous and bring you praise. For we ask it in Jesus name, Amen.

Gospel Mk 14:1 – 15:47 The Passion.

Gospel Focus – This man was a son of God

By the time we have stood and listened to this lengthy Passion narrative, the listener may have started to wilt by the time we get to the death of Jesus. Yet the gospel writer keeps one of the most important messages for this moment. As Jesus dies, a centurion standing by utters the inspired words, 'In truth, this man was a son of God.' Famously played by John Wayne in the movie, The Greatest Story Ever Told, the centurion is the voice of the gentile - the non-Jew - representing all those throughout the world who will recognise the truth of Jesus' life and purpose.

Have you thought? Passion of the Passion

The Passion narrative is very aptly named. The emotion and power of this story is nothing short of passionate. The gospel writer's style of fast paced, unadorned factual narrative is a very effective way of helping the reader/listener to engage in the story. It is, after all, the first half of the most important Christian story - finished off by the resurrection that is celebrated on Easter Sunday. It is easy to see why this stark, narrative style was embellished and expanded upon by the later gospel writers and yet it is perhaps the more passionate for the lack of explanation and theologising. We have this lead in time for wearing the Winter Uniform to cater for the unpredictability of temperatures at that time of the year.

- Parents are required to maintain 1.5m physical distancing while at the sale
- Donations for uniforms purchased will be by EFTPOS only

This week our Year 3 and 5 students sat their Practice Online Naplan test. We are very proud of the students' effort this week and believe that St Angela's is ready for the Naplan Online in May. The Testing window is between **Tuesday 11th May and Friday 21st May.** Students in Year 3 and 5 will sit the Writing test on Tuesday 11th May. The students will then follow the test sequence of Reading, Conventions of language and Numeracy throughout the test window. Can we ask that any appointments or planned days off school are kept to minimum for year 3 and 5 during this time as it can be disruptive to the students completing Naplan tests.

Children's Work Books Coming Home

Tomorrow your child will be showcasing their learning in the Key Learning Areas of Writing and Mathematics by bringing home their books, work folders, etc and for our older students, showcasing their work in google classrooms.

In your child's Writing books, please take the time to look through, discuss and enjoy the work and responses your child has completed.

Also coming home will be your child's Mathematics books. Please note that not all mathematical thinking is recorded in workbooks. Children undertake a great deal of mental computation, reasoning and problem solving. They are also often required to articulate their thinking in a group.

We encourage you to write a comment to your child in their book after their last piece of work. Children really do treasure your comments and it allows us to see that the book did indeed leave the school bag and that you have taken the time to walk through it with your child. Additionally, we ask that the books be returned promptly the next school day so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.
